



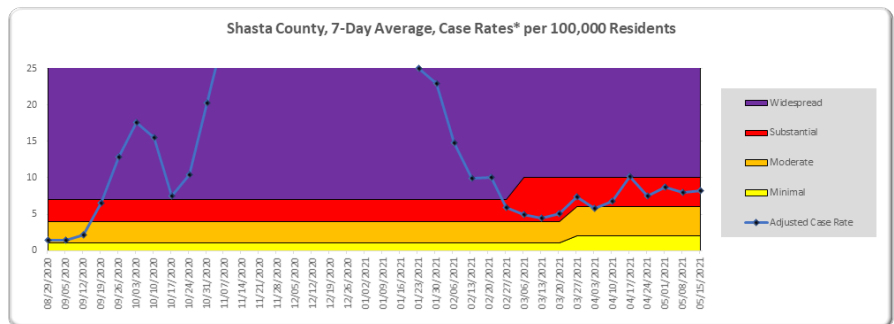
## COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: May 25, 2021

Statistics from May 23 and 24, 2021

### CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 28 cases Sunday and Monday, including 11 men and 17 women:
  - 4 children under age 13
  - 2 teenagers
  - 4 people in their 20s
  - 4 people in their 30s
  - 3 people in their 40s
  - 5 people in their 50s
  - 1 person in their 60s
  - 3 people in their 70s
  - 1 person over age 89
  - 1 person of unknown age



- Shasta County remains in the red (“substantial”) tier, with both measurements going up this week. Our adjusted case rate increased from 8.0 to 8.2 daily cases per 100,000 residents, and our positivity rate increased from 3.4% to 3.7%.
- Shasta County now has its highest number of people hospitalized with COVID-19 since March 3. As case rates increase, we can expect an increase in hospitalizations followed by an increase in deaths. - Question:** How soon can I get vaccinated after having COVID-19? **Answer:** You can be vaccinated as soon as you are out of isolation, as long as you have no symptoms. The exception is for people who were treated with monoclonal antibodies, who must wait 90 days after recovering from COVID-19 to receive the vaccine.
- Uber and Lyft are offering free rides (up to \$15 each way) to vaccination appointments. Instructions are available on the Uber and Lyft websites and apps.
- The state’s testing site at Shasta College and the vaccination site at the Redding Senior Center will be closed on Monday, May 31, in observance of Memorial Day. Usually, the testing site is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, and the vaccination site is open Friday through Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.
