CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 32 cases Tuesday, including 11 men and 21 women:
 - 5 children under age 13
 - 2 teenagers
 - 4 people in their 20s
 - 9 people in their 30s
 - 6 people in their 40s
 - 4 people in their 50s
 - 2 people in their 60s
- We are sorry to report a death today. She was a woman in her 70s.
- This report includes a weekly update to our total case numbers, as we have been conducting case investigations to correct reported cases that were duplicates or out-of-county records.
- A clinic in Lakehead is planned this Saturday, May 29, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. This is a second-dose clinic for anyone who received their first dose of Moderna on or before May 1, and the Johnson & Johnson one-dose shot will also be available. You can schedule an appointment at www.myturn.ca.gov or just walk in.
- The state's testing site at Shasta College and the vaccination site at the Redding Senior Center will be closed on Monday, May 31, in observance of Memorial Day. Usually, the testing site is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, and the vaccination site is open Friday through Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- COVID-19 vaccines are effective at keeping you from getting COVID-19. But they have other benefits, too. In the rare case that you do still get COVID-19, the vaccine may help keep you from getting seriously ill. Getting vaccinated yourself may also protect people around you, [particularly people at increased risk for severe illness from COVID-19](#). Vaccination is a safer way to help build immunity. COVID-19 can have [serious, life-threatening complications](#), and there is no way to know how COVID-19 will affect you.
