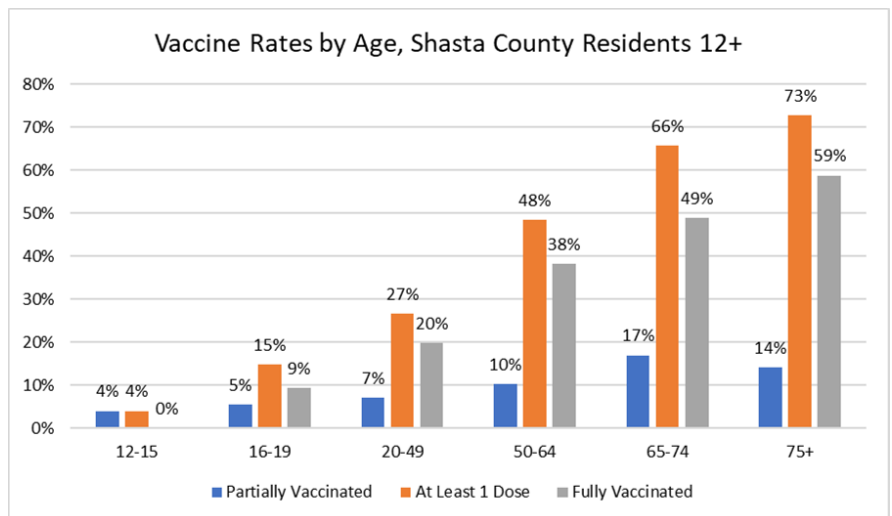

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 32 cases Friday through Monday, including 10 men, 21 women and 1 person of unknown gender:

- 2 children under age 13
- 4 teenagers
- 7 people in their 20s
- 6 people in their 30s
- 5 people in their 40s
- 4 people in their 50s
- 2 people in their 60s
- 2 people in their 80s



- Vaccination numbers are slowly growing. In Shasta County, 44.3% of eligible people have received at least one dose, and 34.1% are fully vaccinated. Statewide, 64.6% of eligible people have received at least one dose and 51.6% are fully vaccinated.
- Shasta County remains in the red (“substantial”) tier, but both measurements improved this week. Our adjusted case rate decreased from 8.2 to 6.3 daily cases per 100,000 residents, and our positivity rate decreased from 3.7% to 2.9%.
- A drive-through clinic is planned from 6 to 8:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 9, at Shasta County Public Health, 2650 Breslauer Way in Redding. This is a second-dose clinic for anyone who received their first dose of Pfizer on or before May 19, and the Johnson & Johnson one-dose shot will also be available. You can schedule an appointment at www.myturn.ca.gov or just drive up.
- Anyone who gets either a first or second dose of COVID-19 vaccine between June 1-25 at any Shasta Community Health Center location will receive one ticket to the Shasta District Fair, while supplies last. Make an appointment at www.myturn.ca.gov and select a clinic marked “Shasta Community Health Center.”
