



COVID-19 INCIDENT UPDATE: June 11, 2021

CURRENT SITUATION

- We had 21 cases Thursday, including 8 men and 13 women:
 - 4 children under age 13
 - 1 teenager
 - 5 people in their 20s
 - 1 person in their 30s
 - 5 people in their 40s
 - 2 people in their 50s
 - 2 people in their 60s
 - 1 person over age 89
- In Shasta County, 97 people have tested positive for a variant. Variants can be concerning because they can be more infectious or less responsive to vaccine. Variants found in Shasta County are:
 - B.1.1.7 (Alpha, originated in the United Kingdom) = 39 confirmed cases
 - B.1.351 (Beta, originated in South Africa) = 7 confirmed cases
 - B.1.427 (Epsilon, originated in the United States) = 14 confirmed cases
 - B.1.429 (Epsilon, originated in the United States) = 37 confirmed cases

Two people with confirmed variants have been hospitalized – one with Epsilon (B.1.429) and one with Alpha. One person with confirmed Beta (B.1.351) has died. None were fully vaccinated.

- In Shasta County, 42.3% of eligible people have received at least one dose of vaccine, and 32.8% are fully vaccinated. Among people 65 and older, 54.6% of people are fully vaccinated.
- **Question:** What happens when California moves [Beyond the Blueprint](#) on June 15? **Answer:** Restaurants, shopping malls, movie theaters, and most everyday places will be open as normal, with no capacity limits or social distancing required. This does not apply to schools, health care settings and some other public settings. Some public health measures will remain for mega events (5,000+ people indoors or 10,000+ outdoors). Masks will still be required indoors for unvaccinated people. California will keep a close eye on vaccination and infection rates over the summer and keep these guidelines in place until at least October 1, 2021.
