

COVID -19 Vaccine Rollout



This is the order in which people can be vaccinated in Shasta County.

Phase 1A: 3 Tiers

This phase focuses on people at high risk of exposure to COVID-19 through work in any role in direct health care or long-term care settings.

✓ means these groups are eligible for vaccine.

Tier 1

- ✓ Acute care, psychiatric and correctional facility hospitals
- ✓ Staff and residents of skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, special needs group living, and similar settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals
- ✓ Staff of *residential* substance abuse disorder (SUD) treatment centers
- ✓ Staff of *residential* behavioral health facilities
- ✓ Paramedics, EMTs and others providing emergency medical services
- ✓ Staff of dialysis centers

Tier 2

- ✓ Staff of intermediate care, for people who need non-continuous nursing supervision and supportive care
- ✓ Home health care and in-home supportive services
- ✓ Staff of *outpatient* Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment centers, behavioral health programs, and crisis stabilization units
- ✓ Community health workers, including promotoras
- ✓ Public Health field staff with patient contact
- ✓ Primary care clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers, rural health centers, correctional facility clinics and urgent care clinics

Tier 3

- ✓ Specialty clinics
- ✓ Laboratory workers
- ✓ Dental and oral health clinics
- ✓ Pharmacy staff not working in settings at higher tiers
- ✓ Mortuary service industry
- ✓ Massage therapists

Phase 1B

Tier 1

- ✓ People age 65 years and older
- ✓ Workers in education and child care, including foster care and library staff
- ✓ Workers in emergency services, including utility workers, disaster service workers and social workers
- ✓ Food and agriculture workers, including restaurants, grocery stores, pharmacies, convenience stores, retailers that sell food or beverages and animal/pet food, food manufacturers, farmers and ranch workers, suppliers of food products, and food banks*
- ✓ Janitors
- ✓ People age 16-64 with severe health conditions**
- ✓ Staff and residents of detention facilities, homeless shelters and behavioral health facilities
- ✓ People experiencing homelessness
- ✓ Public transit/airport and commercial airlines

** Severe health conditions include:

- Cancer, current with weakened immune system
- Chronic kidney disease, stage 4 or above
- Chronic pulmonary disease, oxygen dependent
- Down syndrome
- Solid organ transplant, leading to a weakened immune system
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies (but not hypertension)
- Severe obesity (Body Mass Index greater than 40kg/m²)
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus with hemoglobin A1c level greater than 7.5%
- Certain individuals with developmental or other severe disabilities or illness, including physical and behavioral disabilities - [learn more here](#)
