

Your Rights Under Title VI Of The Civil Rights Act of 1964

Title VI is a section of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 requiring that “No person in the United States shall on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.” In addition, related statutes provide protection against discrimination on the grounds of age, sex, or disability.

Any person who feels that he or she, individually or as a member of any class of persons, on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, sex, or disability has been excluded from or denied the benefits of, or subjected to discrimination caused by a Shasta County employees may file a written complaint with the Shasta County Title VI Coordinator. Federal and State law requires complaints be filed within one-hundred eighty (180) calendar days of the alleged discrimination.
