1.	In the interest of figuring the travel time and such, can you provide a list (generally) of the generators/engines/equipment with locations where our technicians may be travelling?	The response area is Shasta County in its entirety. The bulk of the generators are in the Redding Area, and/or on the Valley floor. However, there are generators in the East County area as far as Fall River. No locations are further than 1.5hrs travel from Redding and all are within Shasta County's borders. 2.	Is the county looking to put together an annual schedule of services on certain generators/engines/switchgear? Certainly, will need that list of machines to do that when it comes to that point, or, is the county still looking to call in as needed for service on said machines? List would still help.	In Section I. Overview – The County states in the introduction “for the purpose of providing on call and as needed maintenance service, repair and short-term rental of equipment incident to a repair or service.”	Posted to Public Purchase and County website on 12/27/2021

Performance bond – Again, list of machines and desired annual maintenance on those machines would be needed to come up with a performance bond amount and thus come up with the expense to be incurred by the service provider obtaining said performance bond. Other partners we have put together annual service pricing per machine and that allowed Peterson to come up with a performance bond amount and calculate the expense of that performance bond. Any straggler machines would be handled for service as they come up.	Per the County's standard Public Works Contract any project totaling greater than \$4,000.00; (including labor, materials, overhead, etc.) is required to provide a performance bond for the total project cost.
